Xavier Institute of Management and Entrepreneurship (XIME) in association with Narayana Hrudayalaya Hospitals, Ramakrishna Healthcare & Trauma Centre and Electronics City Industries Association (ELCIA) organized a walkathon on, Sunday 9th of September 2012 at Electronics City. The event was inaugurated by Mr. Babu Rangaswamy, President ELCIA Trust and Business Head, HP and Ms. Ramakrishna, COO, Narayana Hrudayalaya Hospitals.

The walkathon, which comprised of two events, a 5 km walk and 10 km run, was organized in and around the vicinity of Electronics City. More than 550 participants, including academicians, professionals, staff and students from other B-schools participated in the event. Both the 5 km and 10 km events were flagged off by the President of XIME, Prof. J. Philip in the presence of the chief guests. Participants who included men and women, young and old, displayed their athletic spirits as they competed against each other on the pleasant Sunday morning.

This is a first of its kind event organized by XIME and has set benchmarks for other events to follow. The event was organized by the social wing of XIME called XSEED. The aim of the walkathon is to spread awareness on the prevailing health conditions of school going children and to improve their health. With active support from leading hospital chains such as Narayana Hrudayalaya and Ramakrishna Hospitals, the proceeds from the event will be used to provide free health check-up to 4099 students belonging to 14 different local government schools located in the vicinity of Electronics City.

The collaboration with huge hospital chains such as Narayana Hrudayalaya and St. Johns Hospitals provided a significant boost to the event. This also ensured that the benefits from the event reach the children. This state level, Inter B-School debate competition is held in memory of Maria Philip, daughter of the President, Prof. J Philip, with teams from prominent B-Schools like IIM Bangalore, TAPMI among others. Participants were judged by a panel of judges with Ms. Chitra Talwar, former VP (Global Sales) Pepsico Beverages International, New York, as the chairperson. The Chief Guest for the occasion was Mr. S. Chandrasekhar, MD, Bhorkula Power Corporation and Former Chairman, CII Karnataka. Each team consisted of two members who were asked to speak both for and against the topic: "Should India focus on being a Superpower or a Developed Nation?".

Participants put forth various facts such as rampant malnutrition, lack of access to basic facilities like electricity and health care and the below poverty line status of a large proportion of the country's population. All of these questioned India's quest to attain the status of a superpower, in view of the fact that fundamental requirements are yet to be met by the country. Three key areas of agriculture, tourism and demographic dividend were identified which could be used to overcome the gaps in proper development of the nation.

However, there were other viewpoints that elaborated on the various reasons due to which India should concentrate on becoming a superpower. These mainly involved the country's large military, large sized economy and demographic dividend.

The first prize was awarded to the team from T.A. Pai Management Institute, while the contestants from IIM Bangalore were declared the runners up. The debate was exciting and informative and prompted every member in the audience section to think about his/her role in contributing towards the development of the nation, whether to achieve a developed nation status or to become a superpower.

Dr. Donald E Hawkins, Eisenhower Professor of Tourism Policy, from the School of Business, George Washington (GW) University, visited XIME, Bangalore on 20th August 2012. The distinguished Professor, with expertise in the field of tourism in a wide spectrum of areas such as tourism planning, policy analysis, sustainable tourism, ecotourism and environmental management, visited the upcoming Kochi campus of XIME accompanied by our distinguished President Prof. J. Philip. Dr. Hawkins met the senior faculty members and also addressed the students.

Industrial Visits

Times of India

The students of XIME made a visit to the manufacturing facility of Times of India on 27th September, 2012. They were given a warm welcome and the VP, Mr. Alan Carvalho, took time out of his busy schedule to personally give the students details of the functioning of the facility. The Bangalore manufacturing unit of TOI is one of the most renowned paper manufacturing facility in the world and the best TOI manufacturing facility in India.

Mr. Carvalho explained to the students the various factors that are considered while producing and marketing the newspaper. He also described the whole process of production, giving the students a technical understanding. He spoke about the importance of advertising while selling a newspaper, and also briefed the students about the evolution of paper from black and white to full colour. The students were later accompanied by floor executives to the production area where they explained the functioning of various machines. The visit helped students in understanding the world of newsprint.

TVS

As part of the corporate grooming initiatives at XIME, students visited the Hosur plant of TVS Motors as part of their industrial visit on 8th September, 2012. TVS Motors is the third largest two-wheeler manufacturer in India and one among the top ten in the world, with annual turnover of more than \$1 billion in the previous financial year and is the flagship company of the \$4 billion TVS Group which deals with a wide range of automobiles ranging from motorcycles, variomatic scooters and mopeds. Students were enthralled by the manufacturing facilities at the factory and had an enlightening discussion with senior company personnel thereby gaining practical insight into the business, its manufacturing operations and how the industry operates. A step by step guided tour of the factory gave insights to the students about the schematic processes abundant in TVS. With a customer base of over 1 million and expanding, the industrial visit to TVS Motors was very memorable.

Taegu Tec

Students visited the manufacturing plant of Taegu Tec on 25th October, 2012. The visit was an excellent learning experience and all the students were in awe of the way the factory worked. The factory used technologically advanced machines that did most of the work, due to which there was a minimal requirement of employees in the factory. The factory was also extremely neat and tidy which was unusual for a shop floor.

The class was divided into batches which toured the factory and learnt how the company manufactured its products ranging from ISO standardised tools to specialised proprietary products. The tools are manufactured to precision with extreme care to ensure that the products are of high quality and functionality. This industrial visit was a very useful and important field trip for the students to better understand operations management and actual work dynamics on the floor of a manufacturing plant.

Blood Donation Camp

'In life, it's not very difficult to get what you want. But it's difficult to know what you want'

These were the opening words of Dr. S. Chandrasekhar, IBM VP & Head -HR (India, S.E Asia), who visited XIME on 24th August, 2012 and delivered an engaging address. The main message communicated to the students was the present scenario in the market on new jobs and hiring techniques. The tips on getting hired evoked a lot of interest in the audience. The advice of not running after brands, building up entrepreneural abilities, going after the content of the job rather than the pay scale, building in depth knowledge about subjects and honing the presentation skills was spot-on.

Dr. Chandrasekhar spoke of the challenges of doing nitty gritty work successfully, reinvesting in one's own merit to sharpen it further and the ability to differentiate between temporary success and innovation. The talk ended with a general description of the procedure of hiring and comments on the impact of the current economic performance of the country on various organizations, presaging a decrease in the robustness with which MBA students were hired earlier. It was a very stimulating talk for the students of XIME and made their day.

Mr. R. Narayanan, Financial Controller, Sequoia Capital India Advisors Pvt. Ltd. delivered the guest lecture on the topic "How to incorporate Corporate Governance while preparing a business plan" on 26th October, 2012 at the Xavier Institute of Management and Entrepreneurship (XIME), Bangalore campus. He provided insights on the characteristics essential to become a successful entrepreneur and how Sequoia Capital zeroes in on ventures for their investments. The importance of sound practices of corporate governance while running a business was the hot topic of discussion and he cited examples from his previous experience as head of a leading IT firm overseas.

Mr. Narayanan emphasised the need to prepare a business plan that contains all the necessary information about the business, in addition to sound business principles. This, he said, must be the unique selling proposition through which new start-ups could attract venture capitalists. The speaker also spoke about the need to encourage entrepreneurship in today's competitive environment by providing them with the ecosystem needed to sustain their business and ended the interactive discussion by taking questions from the audience.
